The Adopt-a-Highway program (AAH) provides a unique way for our church family to minister in our neighborhood! Participants typically enjoy a bit of fellowship, get a little exercise, and enjoy the immense satisfaction of helping care for God's creation.

AAH volunteers agree to pick up litter at least two times a year over a two-mile stretch of highway. Each year, nearly 18,000 AAH volunteers collect more than 25,600 bags of waste along Virginia's roads, saving over \$1.35 million that would have otherwise been spent.
